
Request for Allocation of Carry Forward Funds for Fiscal Year 2019/2020

The Sheriff's Office requests allocation of FY 2019/2020 carry forward funds in the amount of \$138,861. The carry forward allocation will be used to fund the following:

- Installation of cameras on transportation buses not completed in FY 2018/19, at a cost of \$11,050;
- Purchase of the scheduling software previously approved by the CCP, at a cost of \$67,000;
- Replacement of the Lerdo kitchen ceiling at a cost of \$56,000;

(Kern County – SIT Participating Agencies)

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, (“**Amendment No. 3**”), made and entered into on _____, between the COUNTY OF KERN, a political subdivision of the State of California (“**County**”), and STREET INTERDICTION TEAM PARTICIPATING AGENCIES (“**SIT**”). County and SIT may be individually referred to as “**Party**” and collectively as “**Parties.**”

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into Agreement No. 353-2012 dated June 05, 2012, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern and is hereby incorporated herein by this reference (“**MOU**”); and

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into Amendment No. 1 to MOU (Agreement No. 082-2013) dated February 12, 2013, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern and is incorporated herein by this reference, whereby Parties agreed to add Kern High School District Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into Amendment No. 2 to MOU (Agreement No. 460-2017) dated August 08, 2017, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern and is incorporated herein by this reference, whereby Parties agreed Kern Chiefs will appoint a Chief from a participating agency as Chairperson to oversee the activities of SIT, to further define SIT deployment and operational plan requirements, to clarify invoicing and reimbursement requirements, SIT resources may be utilized during a critical incident, and to add the Kern County General Services, Parks and Recreation Division as a participating SIT agency; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree future amendments to this MOU shall be presented and approved by the Community Corrections Partnership prior to submission to the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to add the Kern County District Attorney as a participating SIT agency to begin on July 1, 2019, abiding by all terms and conditions of the MOU.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED as follows:

1. The Amendment No. 3 described herein shall become effective July 01, 2019.
2. Except as amended or replaced herein, all provisions, terms and conditions in the Memorandum of Understanding shall remain in full force and effect.
3. Section 6. Modifications, Additions and/or Deletions to Memorandum of Understanding is added to the MOU to read as follows:
Modifications, additions, and/or deletions to this MOU shall be accomplished by mutually agreeable amendment. The Chairperson shall present proposed amendments to the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) for approval as it pertains to AB 109 activities. Upon approval, CCP Chairperson shall submit amendments to the Board of Supervisors for final approval and execution.
4. COUNTY desires to add the Kern County District Attorney's as a participating SIT agency to begin on July 01, 2019, abiding by all terms and conditions of the Memorandum of Understanding.
