

Despite some initial resistance and personal hardships, he was able to successfully complete the program. Since graduating, he continues to visit the APC and discusses how he still uses the tools he was provided when he is in difficult situations. He continues to demonstrate a positive attitude and encourages others stating, "It's never too late to make a positive change in your life." 


A 39-year old male on AB 109 Supervision, with a lengthy criminal history for violence, weapons and gang related offenses, was contacted by probation officers conducting a compliance check at his reported address. During the initial search and subsequent investigation, officers located a large quantity of methamphetamine, a stolen vehicle, hundreds of rounds of ammunition, and two firearms. The probationer was arrested and ultimately convicted of the charges, resulting in a commitment to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.




Success Story

Mental Health Systems Kern ACTion is currently providing case management services for a 39- year old female client who has an 8-year history of heroin use. She is currently in the Maintenance Stage of Recovery and has been abstinent from drug use since November 2015. She attributes part of her success to receiving Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for opiate addiction. During treatment with MHS, she successfully transitioned from being homeless to obtaining and maintaining her own apartment and utilizing community resources to obtain food and clothing. She began attending Ashford University online in October 2016 majoring in Business Information Systems and currently holds a 3.2 grade point average. Client has successfully completed probation and has not been arrested since 2013. She is continuing to reestablish a healthy relationship with her 14-year-old son, who was formally in the foster care system and placed in a variety of group homes. She regained parental custody in July 2017 and is diligently seeking services from Henrietta Weill Child Guidance Clinic for his continued growth. Client states, "Keeping my sobriety, having my own place to live, and having my son living with me motivates me to make positive changes in life.




Success Story

After being screened in jail and diagnosed with major depression a client was referred to the Co-Response Team. The client had served several terms in the Electronic Monitoring Program (EMP). The Client was determined to succeed and feels learned many lessons due to the previous attempts. The Client and MET Co-Response staff gave 100% efforts in the journey to recovery. The client attended and successfully completed several rehabilitative drug program classes. At the end of the residential treatment program, the client extended the stay in a CCP funded Sober Living Home to avoid the risky drug environment that had hindered their progress before. The client is now gainfully employed and a productive member of the community. The client proactively calls and/or visits the co-response team to report their status. The client recently called to report they are doing so well on the job and for the first time - was able to open a savings account to purchase a vehicle for further independence. The client is working towards obtaining a GED, the first step toward a goal of obtaining an Alcohol and Drug Counselor Certificate from CSUB. The client has been linked to and is receiving services from a BHRS contract provider. The client resides in an SLE where staff have been very influential in the client's recovery, sobriety, and successful completion of the program.

This story centers around a whole family that struggled with substance abuse and sought help at a Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) contracted Sober Living Enviornment (SLE). The father was the first to enroll into the program. The father then reached out to his wife and she enrolled in the SLE's female home. Their son shortly followed and entered as well. They have all worked very hard while participaing in the program. The father is now employed making \$25 per hour and has since rolled over as a self paying client. The mother plans on enrolling in college and the son is working towards his GED with another CCP contracted program. A 32-year old male on Supervision, with a lengthy criminal history of drug offenses and weapon charges, first enrolled into the Adult Programs Center (APC) in November of 2016. He was discharged shortly afterward due to a new law violation and re-enrolled into APC in April of 2017. Early intervention was successful and he began to express, demonstrate, and own a desire to change his life for himself and his family. He successfully completed the program in March of 2018 and is scheduled to terminate probation successfully on 4/6/18. He stated he enjoyed APC because he wasn't treated like another number and the staff helped him tackle his "inner demons."




Officers from AB 109 attempted to make contact with a felony probationer in the south alley of 1309 Niles Street and observed a subject riding his bicycle with an object they believed to be a short barreled rifle, wrapped in a sweatshirt, laid across the handle bars. The officers pursued the subject and eventually made contact with him again on the walkway of a nearby apartment complex. As officers gave the subject commands to stop and drop the firearm, he fled once again. The subject, later identified as a felony probationer assigned to the High Risk Offender (HRO) unit, was eventually apprehended and the loaded short barrel rifle was located on the back porch of an adjacent apartment.




Success Story

A client was arrested for felony vandalism charges and a misdemeanor for failure to appear. The client had an outstanding warrant from Santa Barbara (SB) County and was scheduled to be released to SB county deputies. On the release date, the deputies preparing the client for release noticed the client had selfinflicted cuts and scratches on the face and wrist. SB County deputies determined that the client could not be transported in that condition. The client became so upset, began crying, yelling and cursing profanity at anyone who attempted to speak, KCSO Staff notified Correctional Behavioral Health (CBH) of the situation and asked that the client be evaluated for mental health needs. Client admitted to using methamphetamine prior to the arrest and felt was still "coming down off of it." Client also claimed of sexually assaulted prior to being arrested and admitted they had not told anyone about it until then. Client refused both medical and mental health services and would not consent to psychiatric treatment on a voluntary basis. A Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) interview was conducted and the client was evaluated for a possible 5150 hold. Client agreed to give the father's phone number to staff. CBH was able to contact the father in Oregon who shared he was very concerned about his child, and they had been estranged for 2 years. A discharge plan was initiated which included client's father. Collaborating staff coordinated with the father to get the client to Oregon where the client is now. Family of the client was very appreciative of the services and results received from Kern County.


Officers from AB 109 conducted a probation search of a 290 registrant (sex offender) in Delano, CA. During the probation search, officers located a large safe which contained numerous firearms, a large amount of marijuana and cocaine packaged for sale. A search warrant was authored for the property as a whole. During the subsequent investigation, a large amount of marijuana and cocaine packaged for sales, US currency, an illegal assault rifle, bolt action rifle, shotgun and a hand gun were located and seized. The investigation also revealed the probationer in question, as well as an additional documented criminal street gang member, had access to the large safe and the firearms contained within.




Success Story

The client began working with the Self-Empowerment Team and engaged in bus training. The client now gets around independently. This client is always punctual and consistently attends appointments, groups, and other social activities through the Consumer Family Learning Center and community. This client has been able to form new friendships and support systems. The client has resided at same residence for over a year and is in the process of obtaining own place. The client recently expressed a desire to attend college and become a youth counselor as the client's achievements have rendered a desire to help others. This client continues to work hard, utilizes and maximizes the resources, support and skills offered through the mental health team. This client has unknowingly and without intent, become a role-model to other clients working on their own recovery. This client is the epitome of a success story and has the potential to be a leader in the community one day.
