During the quarter, a 38-year-old female with a lengthy criminal history, successfully completed her Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS). Under the supervision of the Kern County Probation Department, she was referred to the Day Reporting Center (DRC) by her probation officer. She attended all scheduled meetings and always greeted the DRC staff with a smile. After she completed PRCS, she chose to remain active in the program and continue participation in the DRC program. She credits this program with helping her learn to communicate more effectively with her family and peers and maintain her sobriety for nearly one year. Since then, she has graduated from the DRC program, enrolled at the Bakersfield Adult School, and has started the culinary training program through the Bakersfield Navigation Center.









#### **Success Story**






This quarter we'v enrolled 40% of our Felony Probation referrals, 60% of those on Mandatory Supervisio 8.8% of those on Post Release Community Supervision and 3.2% of those on Electroni Monitoring. # AB 109 DATA TRACKERS REPORT FY 22-23 QUARTER 4 (APR 1, 2023 - JUN 30, 2023)

The Kern County Veterans Service Department (KCVSD) has a dedicated Veterans Service Representative (VSR) designated to provide benefit advocacy and case management to veterans (and their families) at any stage in the criminal justice system. The initiative provides access to Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits, California Department of Veterans Affairs benefits, as well as referrals to other community groups in an effort to eliminate barriers to successful reintegration into the community and reduce the recidivism rate of veteran offenders.

KCVSD has established a direct line of communication to incarcerated veterans via Kern Valley State Prison psychologists; this provides an opportunity to assist these incarcerated veterans by filing claims related to psychological trauma suffered during their time in service. Staff and inmates have the means of communicating through Zoom on tablets provided by the state prison. Future goals of KCVSD is to develop similar connections within other institutions throughout Kern County.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR PARTICIPATING AGENCIES TO OPERATE AS THE STREET INTERDICTION TEAM ("SIT") FOR ACTIVITIES RELATED TO ASSEMBLY BILL 109

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** ("**MOU**") is made and entered into on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, ("**EXECUTION DATE**") by and between the participating agencies of the Street Interdiction Team ("**SIT**") and the COUNTY OF KERN ("**COUNTY**"), a political subdivision of the State of California. COUNTY and participating agencies of SIT may be individually referred to as "**PARTY**" and collectively as "**PARTIES**."

#### WITNESSETH:

#### WHEREAS:

- A. The Board of Supervisors approved the first County of Kern, Public Safety Realignment Act of 2011 Implementation Plan on October 25, 2011, pursuant to Assembly Bill 109 ("AB 109"), Public Safety Realignment Act of 2011 signed into law on April 4, 2011, and Penal Code 1230.1, as proposed by the Kern County Community Corrections Partnership ("CCP"); and
- **B.** The CCP determined that there will be a potential increase in street-level crime throughout Kern County as a result of the Realignment; and
- **C.** SIT, established in 2007, is a multi-jurisdictional county-wide task force comprised of local, State, and Federal law enforcement agencies with a mission to disrupt, dismantle, and interdict local gang, narcotic, and street crime activity in Kern County communities; and
- **D.** SIT operations as it pertains to AB 109, were approved as part of the Implementation Plan to combat the potential increase in street-level crime as a result of the Realignment; and
- **E.** These operations will be in addition to, and separate from, existing SIT actions; and
- **F.** SIT was allocated funding which will provide regional law enforcement agencies needed additional resources and address public safety concerns for the citizens of Kern County due to the Realignment; and
- **G.** Participating SIT agencies listed in Section 4 desire to support and further the goals and objectives of AB 109 implementation by entering into this MOU; and
- **H.** The Probation Department was designated by the Board of Supervisors on August 2, 2011, as the supervising agency for AB 109 related activities, and the Realignment Implementation Plan indicates that the Probation Department would manage SIT funds allocated for this purpose as operations occur; and

- I. The PARTIES agree Kern Chiefs will appoint a Chief from a participating agency as the Chairperson to oversee the activities of SIT; and
- J. The PARTIES agree SIT operations shall be comprised of a hosting agency and a minimum of one other participating law enforcement agency; and
- **K.** The PARTIES agree to further define SIT deployment and operational plan requirements; and
- L. The PARTIES agree to clarify invoicing and reimbursement requirements as stated in Section 3; and
- **M.** The PARTIES agree SIT resources may be utilized during a critical incident; and
- **N.** The PARTIES agree all Kern County law enforcement agencies and certain participating agencies assisting in SIT operations may participate in SIT; and
- **O.** The PARTIES agree this MOU supersedes prior agreements. All MOUs and amendments prior to this agreement are invalid; and
- PARTIES entered into Agreement No. 353-2012 dated June 5, 2012, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern. The PARTIES agree that the terms and conditions in prior Agreement No. 353-2012 and amendments are incorporated within this MOU, thus voiding the following:
  - Agreement No. 353-2012, approved on June 5, 2012
  - Amendment #1, Agreement No. 082-2013, approved on February 12, 2013
  - Amendment #2, Agreement No. 460-2017, approved on August 8, 2017
  - Amendment #3, Agreement No. 040-2020, approved on January 28, 2020
- Q. The PARTIES agree future amendments to the MOU shall be presented and approved by the Community Corrections Partnership prior to submission to the Board of Supervisors; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the PARTIES mutually agree hereto as follows:

#### 1. TERM

The term of this MOU shall be deemed effective as of July 1, 2023. This MOU may be modified by mutual agreement of the PARTIES at any time. Any individual PARTY may withdraw or terminate their participation in this MOU with a 30-day written notice submitted to the COUNTY; however, should the COUNTY wish to terminate this MOU, then the entire MOU is considered terminated upon 30-day written notice to all PARTIES signed herein.

#### 2. ACTIVITIES OF SIT AS IT PERTAINS TO AB 109 REALIGNMENT

A. Kern Chiefs will appoint a Chief from a participating agency as the Chairperson to oversee SIT activities. The duties of the Chairperson include, but are not limited to, leading monthly SIT meetings, approving SIT deployment/operational plans, and making presentations as necessary.

- B. SIT operations shall be comprised of a hosting agency and a minimum of one other participating law enforcement agency. The hosting agency does not have the authority to dictate or choose the agencies that will participate within a SIT operation. All approved plans shall be distributed to all SIT participating agencies.
- C. A hosting agency will be selected for each operation. The hosting agency is responsible for the deployment/operational plan respective to their area.
- D. SIT shall conduct operations in various areas and locations throughout Kern County depending on the highest degree of AB 109 activities and resources available. The hosting agency will determine locations, dates, times, and teams as mutually agreed upon by all participating agencies.
- E. SIT operations under this MOU will be in addition to, and separate from, existing SIT actions and specifically related to AB 109 activities.

#### 3. DOCUMENTATION, FUNDING AND REIMBURSEMENT

SIT participating agencies understand and agree to the following:

- A. The Kern County Probation Department will be the fiscal agent for the SIT operations as it pertains to AB 109 pursuant to the County of Kern 2011 Public Safety Realignment Implementation Plan and Board of Supervisors approval.
- B. The Kern County Probation Department shall provide a list of potential AB 109 targets for participating agencies.
- C. Deployment/operational plans must be approved by the SIT Chairperson and endorsed by the Kern County Probation Department for a minimum of thirty (30) days in advance of a prospective SIT operation unless prior authorization is granted. Amendments to deployment/operational plans must be approved a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours prior to a SIT Operation.
- D. Deployment/operational plans must be submitted in the format approved by the Chairperson and must contain the following information:
  - i. Contact information of the operation supervisor
  - ii. Operational details including the date, time, and location
  - iii. Number of Pre-Screened Targets
  - iv. Number of participating officers/deputies requested
  - v. Other information as requested such as specifying radio channel frequencies within SIT operation briefings.

- E. All necessary, required, and proper documentation must be provided to support the AB 109 operations including but not limited to timecards/sheets, invoices, billings, data, statistical information, outcomes, operational plans, and reports, to the Kern County Probation Department. Sign-In Sheets and Data Forms completed by the hosting agency must be submitted within one week after the date of SIT operation.
- F. SIT participating agencies agree to attend an annual mandatory fiscal training generally in July, August, or September.
- G. SIT participating agencies agree to submit completed invoices within thirty (30) days immediately following a SIT operation. Invoices not submitted within sixty (60) days of the day immediately following a SIT operation will not be reimbursed, unless given prior authorization by the Kern County Probation Department.
- H. Participating agencies must provide the hosting agency with a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours' notice of the number of personnel intending to participate in a SIT operation. Reimbursement of law enforcement personnel from participating agencies is limited to the number of participating officers/deputies requested in the approved deployment/operation plan.
- I. Law enforcement personnel joining a SIT operation are eligible for reimbursement from their time of arrival to the end of their SIT operation duties.
- J. Law enforcement personnel that are held over due to incidents occurring during the SIT operation and were assigned to and participated in the entirety of a SIT operation are eligible for reimbursement until relieved.
- K. All personnel, including but not limited to Officers, Deputies, Dispatchers, Jailers, Community Service Officers, Probation Technicians, Reserves, and Clerical support staff working on overtime and/or paid additional hours to support SIT operations are eligible for reimbursement.
- L. Law enforcement costs such as supplies, equipment, vehicles, etc. are NOT eligible for AB 109 reimbursement under this MOU and shall be the responsibility of the respective participating agencies.
- M. Exclusions from the SIT reimbursement include comp time earned and hours worked during regular shift schedules.
- N. Participating agencies understand that SIT funding is subject to COUNTY and State budget activities and funding could be eliminated or reduced at any time. By signing this MOU, SIT participating agencies agree that regardless of any claim(s) for reimbursement of SIT operation expenses, the amount to be paid is subject to the balance of AB 109 funds available at any given time for SIT operations. Any claims in excess of amounts available are the responsibility of the requesting agency and not the COUNTY. If funds requested exceed funds available, the balance

of funds remaining will be divided equally based on the percentage of the allowable amounts claimed by all participating agencies.

  - 15) Shafter Police Department
  - 16) Stallion Springs Police Department
  - 17) Taft Police Department

- B. The following agencies are EXCLUDED from receiving SIT reimbursement but may still participate in SIT operations:

- C. Any agency discontinuing as a SIT member participating in this MOU shall be removed as a participating agency by amendment signed by the COUNTY and the agency being removed as a SIT member. Any agency being removed as a SIT member shall be entitled to reimbursement in accordance with this MOU up to and including the date, they notify the SIT Chairperson of their intent to discontinue participation in this SIT MOU.

#### 5. CRITICAL INCIDENTS

In the event of a critical incident, the SIT Chairperson may authorize SIT activities to assist with containment. Reimbursement is dependent on funding availability and is limited to containment or the first seventy-two (72) hours of a critical incident, whichever occurs first. Costs incurred outside of the

parameters set forth and agreed upon in this MOU are the responsibility of the requesting agency and not the COUNTY.

# 6. MODIFICATIONS, ADDITIONS, AND/OR DELETIONS TO THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Modifications, additions, and/or deletions to this MOU shall be accomplished by a mutually agreeable amendment. The Chairperson shall present proposed amendments to the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) for approval as it pertains to AB 109 activities. Upon approval, CCP Chairperson shall submit amendments to the Board of Supervisors for final approval and execution.

SUBJECT: Probation Department's FY 22/23 Carryforward Funds into FY 23/24

The Probation Department is requesting to keep FY 22/23 Carryforward Funds in the amount of \$386,123. The Department will use these funds to enhance AB 109 operations and activities for the Probation Department.

To better meet the growing demands of serving the AB 109 population, the Department plans on leasing a new building to house all adult supervision services in one location. The Department has undertaken additional construction and remodeling to adapt the space for our purposes, but the building will need to be furnished and outfitted with the required technology and security equipment upon completion. It is critical officers conducting case management to have an adequate environment to meet with the offenders under their supervision and provide the necessary services to redirect their behavior in a pro-social manner. The Department is requesting funds to purchase cubicles, office furniture, tables and chairs, and various technology and security related items to accommodate supervision units and the Adult Programs Center. These items will serve to make the Probation Department more efficient in its delivery of Accountability and Opportunity to the AB 109 population.

The Department is currently in the process of purchasing Mobile Data Computers (MDCs) and mounting equipment for all patrol vehicles. However, due to market pressures the cost of outfitting our entire fleet has increased and the Department is requesting additional funding to cover the additional cost.

A significant portion of the Department's current locations and equipment are maintained by Probation Department staff; therefore, the Department is requesting funding to purchase a landscaping trailer, a service truck liftgate and equipment tracking software. This purchase will help ensure the Department's facilities are properly maintained and all equipment is efficiently tracked.

ETR ended Fiscal Year 2022-23 with \$316,848 in unexpended AB 109 Base Funds.

Improved collaboration with partners has generated a significant increase in referrals and enrollments. However, participants who need more than basic assistance need more places to "land". We have obligated nearly \$500,000 in Growth Funds to Paid Work Experience (PWEX) and more than \$270,000 in new Base Funds to support training and supportive services. We recently expanded the AB 109 Team to dedicate more staff to the development of work sites for PWEX and On-the-Job Training opportunities while continuing to maintain teaching schedules at Lerdo, work-readiness and other pre-employment and training activities.

This request includes \$257,488 in additional staff costs, \$58,600 for additional participant training opportunities and supportive services, and \$760 in travel and supplies.
