


During the quarter, officers assigned to the department's Mandatory Supervision Unit within the AB 109 Division, conducted a home call in the 2800 block of Potomac Avenue in Bakersfield. Officers contacted an offender who is on active felony probation. During the search, officers located one loaded Ruger 10/22, .22 caliber rifle, one loaded American Arms .22 caliber revolver, several ammunition magazines, and ammunition in the offender's possession. As a result, the offender was arrested for possession of a firearm by a felon and possession of ammunition by a prohibited person.







Success Story

Less than a year ago, an individual experiencing paranoia and disorganized thoughts became introduced to the Adult Transition Team (ATT). In addition to severe mental health symptoms, this individual also experienced a substance use disorder. This individual engaged with a multidisciplinary treatment team to participate in therapeutic interventions, medication management, substance use disorder treatment, and relapse prevention services to address co-occurring disorders. ATT staff has helped this individual become financially stable via linkage to social security benefits. Recently, the individual demonstrated initiative to seek employment and has successfully obtained a job at a local auto business. ATT will continue to assist in this individual's journey as they plan to move into their own apartment, improve family relationships and increase self-worth and confidence.





Service Participation by SLE Clients

It has been a successful quarter for the CBO program! One of the Sober Living Environment homes recently had a participant complete the program earlier in the year, achieved reunification with their family, and celebrated their child's first birthday. Both the participant and their partner have been working full-time and are doing well. They expect to move out of state soon, purchase their first home and maintain their sobriety. One of the case management provider's noted that all of their out-of-custody participants have completed their programming, with a few participants placed in an SLE and working toward acheiving and maintaining their sobriety.








Success Stories and Updates


Our work experience program continues to provide our participants with practical knowledge that enables them to utilize their skills to obtain employment. One such participant, who successfully completed her probation and work experience, obtained unsubsidized employment with New Opportunities. She is now a Direct Care Staff, earning \$20 an hour, and is working full-time as of November 6, 2024. Another participant, who also successfully completed his probation and work experience, found gainful employment with Community Services Employment Training (CSET). He was hired on as a General Laborer, earning \$16.50 an hour and working full-time as of December 16, 2024. In addition, this participant enrolled in CSUB's Substance Abuse Program where he is working towards becoming a Substance Abuse Counselor.





AB 109 DATA TRACKERS REPORT FY 24-25 QUARTER 2 (October 1, 2024 - December 31, 2024)

The Kern County Veterans Service Department (KCVSD) has a dedicated Veterans Service Representative (VSR) designated to provide benefit advocacy and case management to veterans (and their families) at any stage in the criminal justice system. The initiative provides access to Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits, California Department of Veterans Affairs benefits, as well as referrals to other community groups in an effort to eliminate barriers to successful reintegration into the community and reduce the recidivism rate of veteran offenders.

KCVSD has established a direct line of communication to incarcerated veterans via Kern Valley State Prison psychologists; this provides an opportunity to assist these incarcerated veterans by filing claims related to psychological trauma suffered during their time in service. Staff and inmates have the means of communicating through Zoom on tablets provided by the state prison. Future goals of KCVSD are to develop similar connections within other institutions throughout Kern County.

BACKGROUND

On October 5, 2022, the CCP awarded contracts to ten (10) Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) to provide services to male and female offenders reentering the community through sober living environments (SLEs), educational, employment, and/or vocational services, DUI education, and case management services. Approximately \$8 million of AB 109 funding was awarded through a competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) process.

The new RFP term will be effective for three years, January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2028. The estimated amount for this new RFP is \$8.5 million. Below is the proposed RFP timeline:
