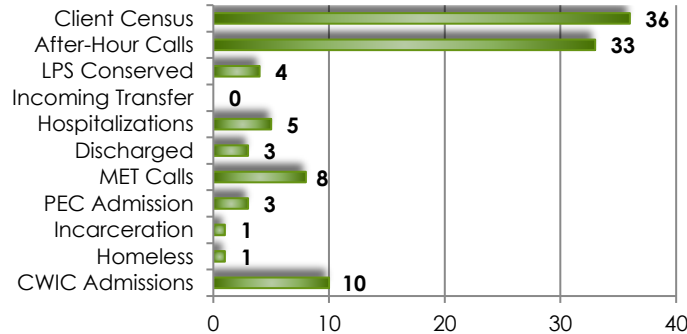
MH Data and Outcomes (n=3 prior; n= 36 since Tx)



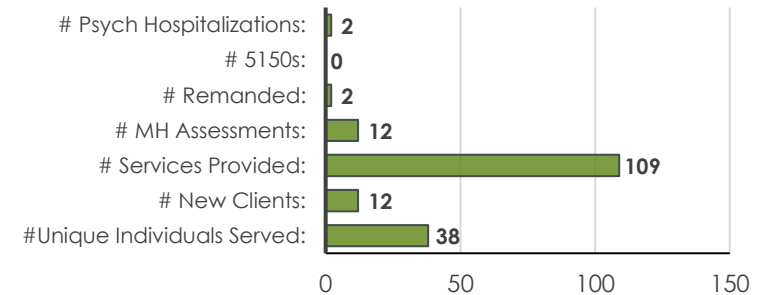

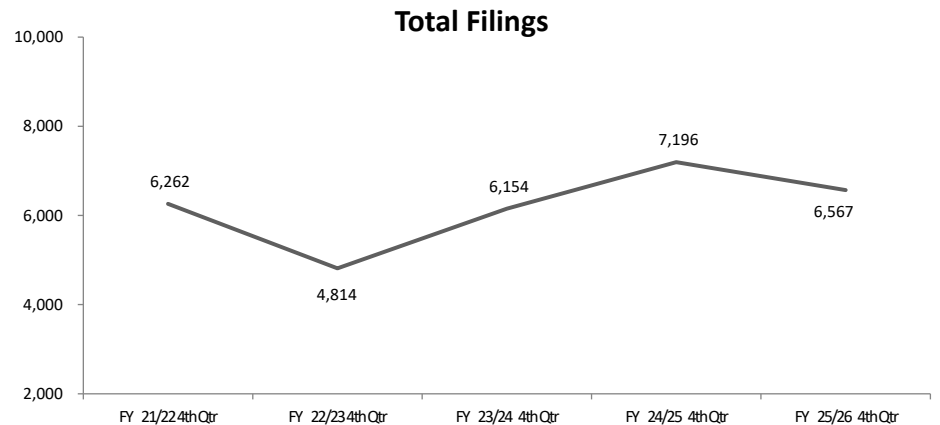
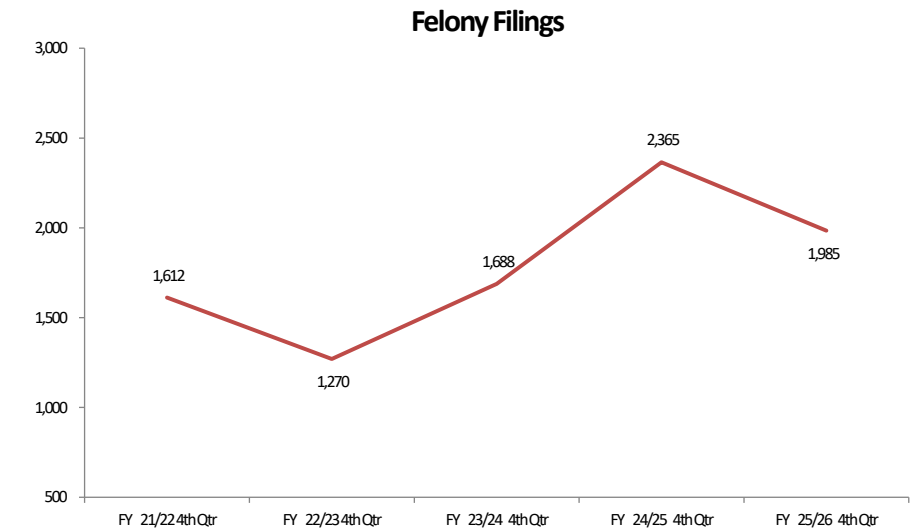
Success Story

The Adult Transition Team (ATT) was introduced to an AB 109 assigned individual this year experiencing psychotic symptoms and difficulty maintaining meaningful relationships with a support system. This individual also disclosed previous justice-involvement and history with substance use. Through intensive case management and therapeutic services with ATT, this individual has been placed in a Sober Living Environment where they have been able to successfully maintain placement with good behavior. Through ATT, the individual was linked with SUD services and has maintained sobriety for two consecutive months. ATT has supported this individual by promoting increased self-advocacy with their community and with probation, encourage reconnection with family to rebuild relationships, and familiarize themselves with the community system for additional support.

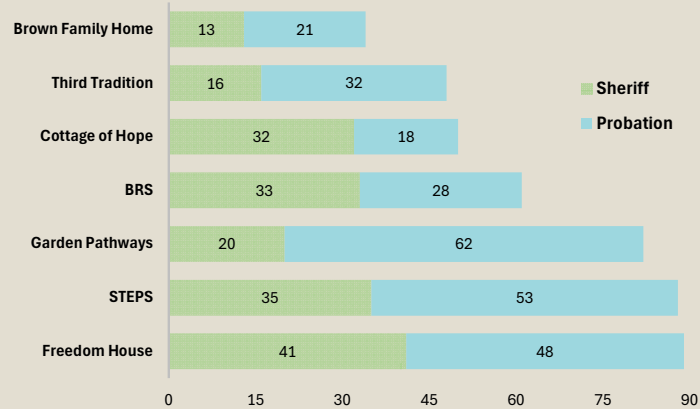

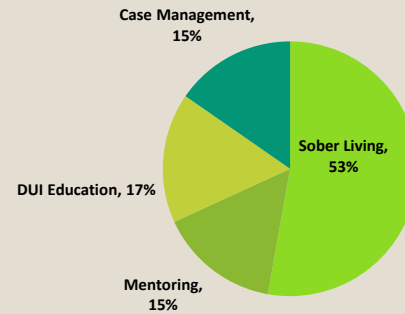

Enrollments



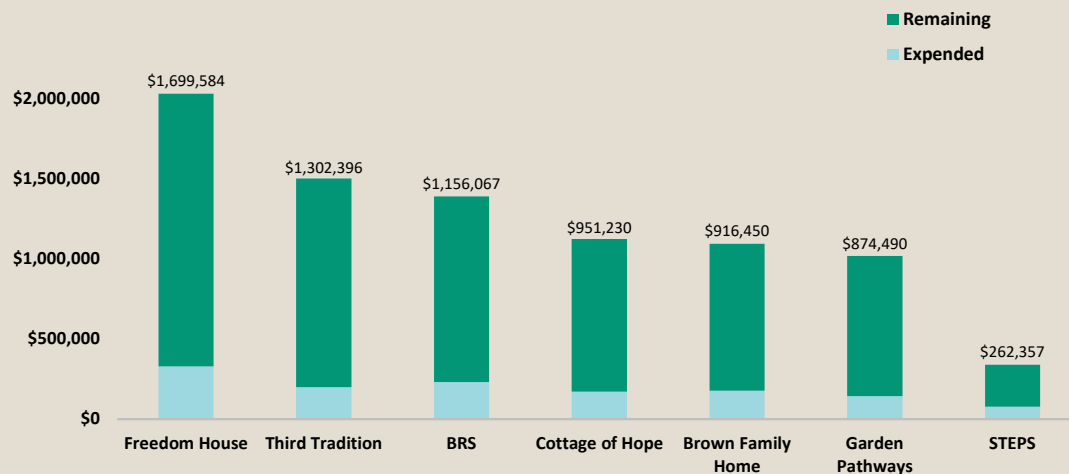
Participants by Service Type



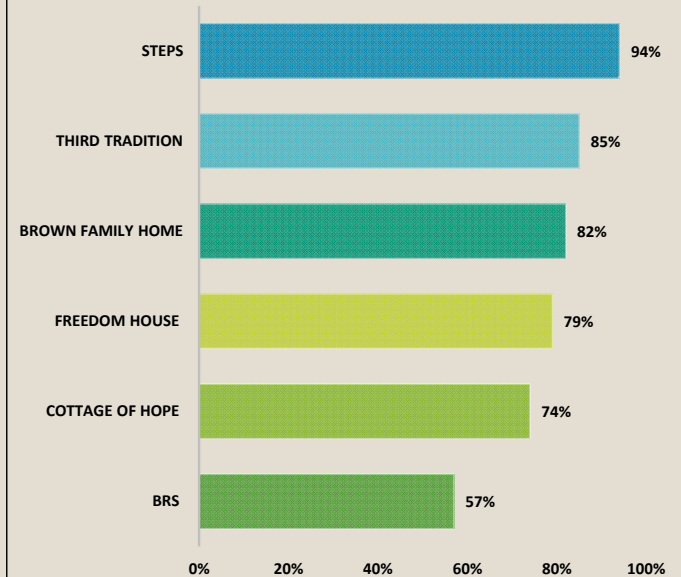
Success Story

Retention Rate



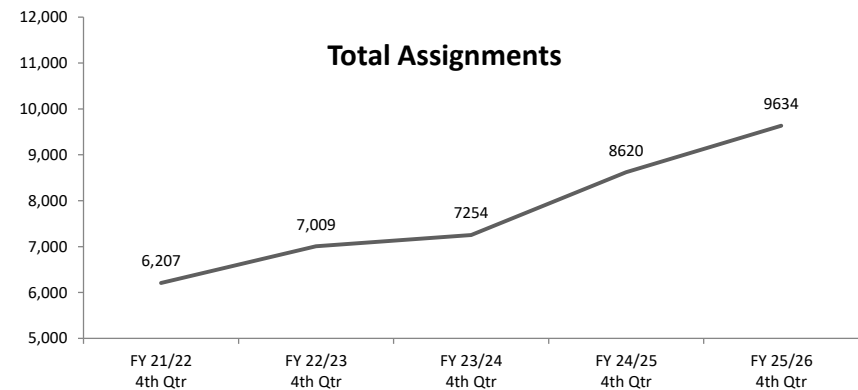
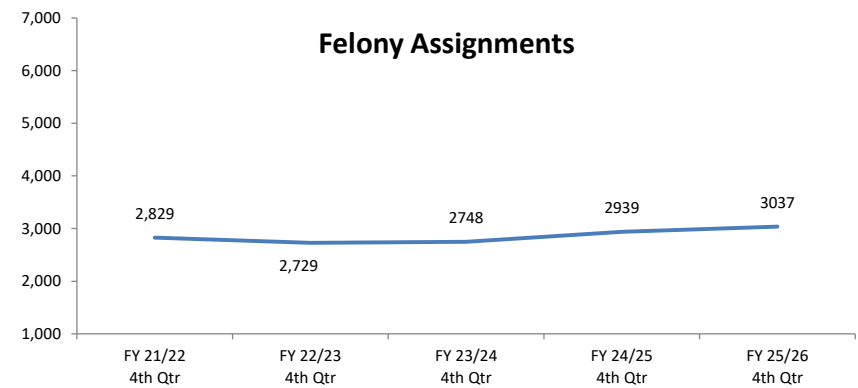

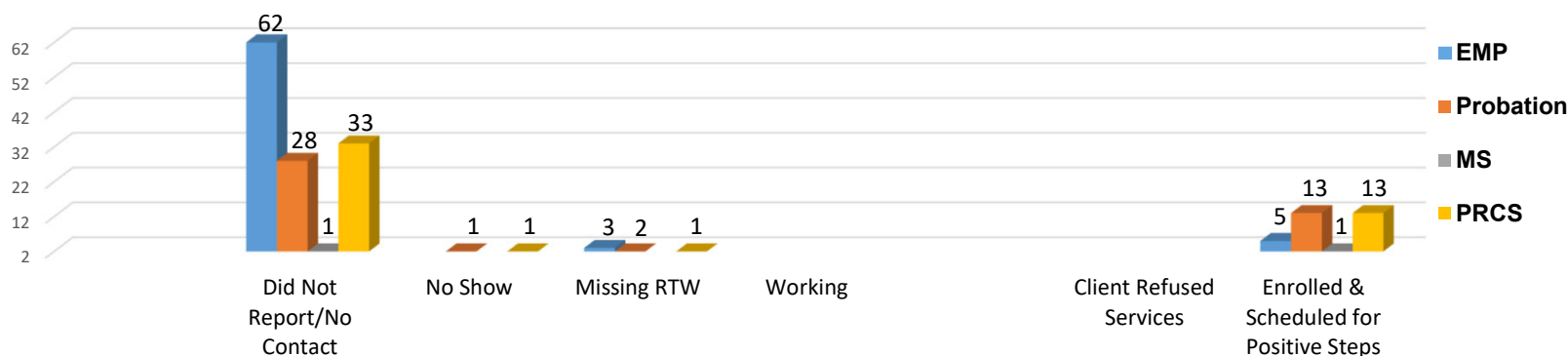

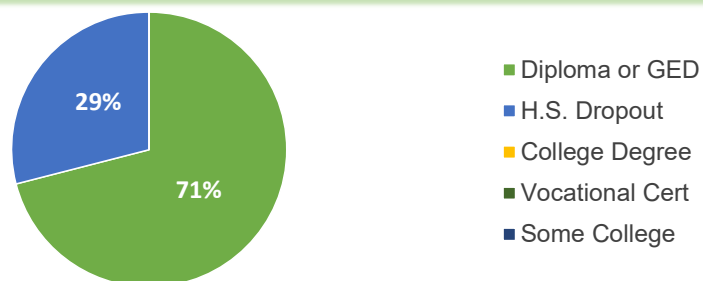

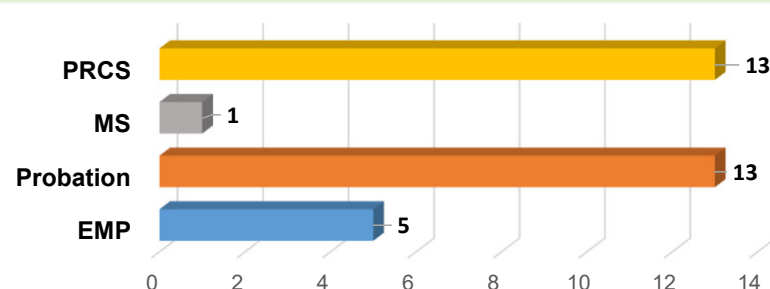
Referral Status



Enrollees' Education Level



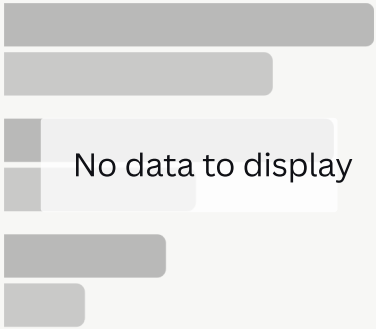
Number Enrolled by Offender Classification



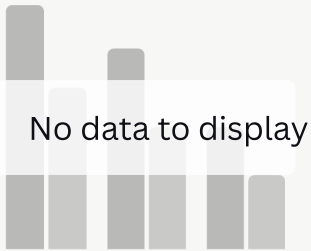

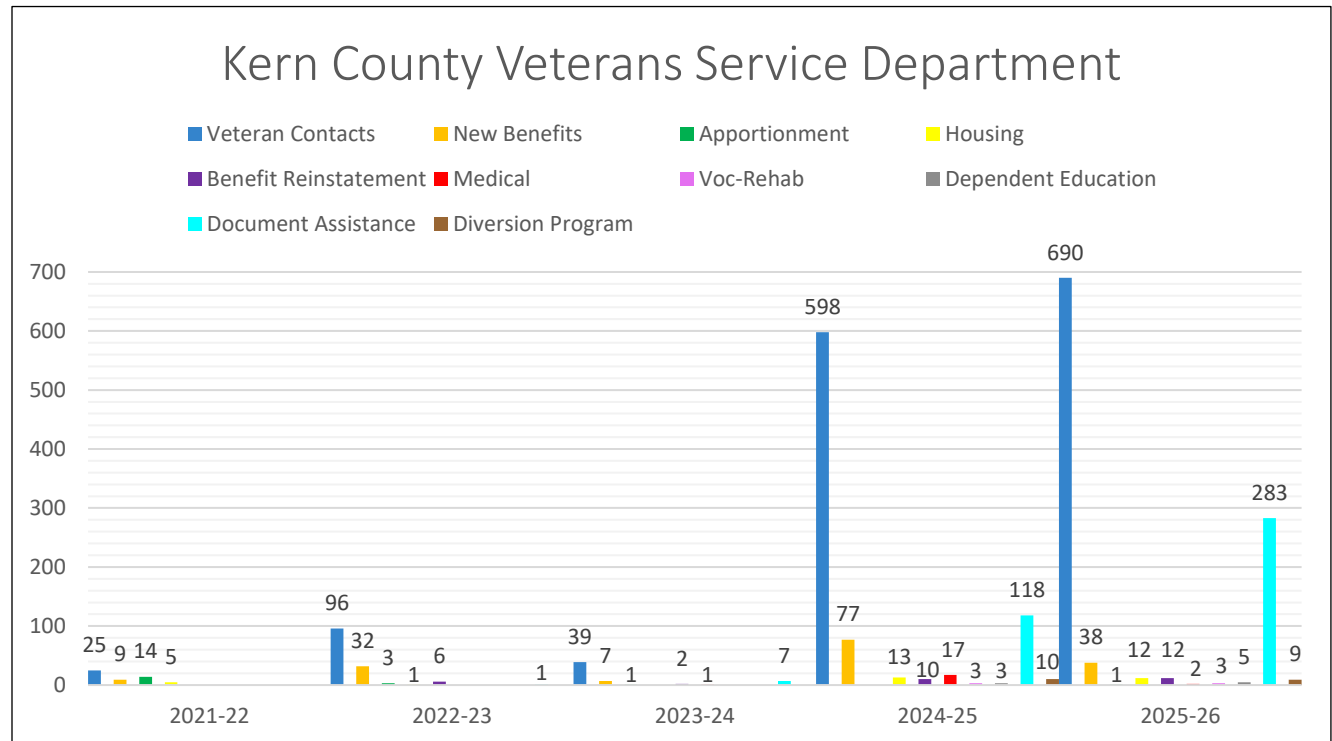

The Kern County Veterans Service Department (KCVSD) has a dedicated Veterans Service Representative (VSR) designated to provide benefit advocacy and case management to veterans (and their families) at any stage in the criminal justice system. The initiative provides access to Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits, California Department of Veterans Affairs benefits, as well as referrals to other community groups in an effort to eliminate barriers to successful reintegration into the community and reduce the recidivism rate of veteran offenders.

KCVSD has established a direct line of communication to incarcerated veterans via Kern Valley State Prison psychologists; this provides an opportunity to assist these incarcerated veterans by filing claims related to psychological trauma suffered during their time in service. Staff and inmates have the means of communicating through Zoom on tablets provided by the state prison. Future goals of KCVSD is to develop similar connections within other institutions throughout Kern County.

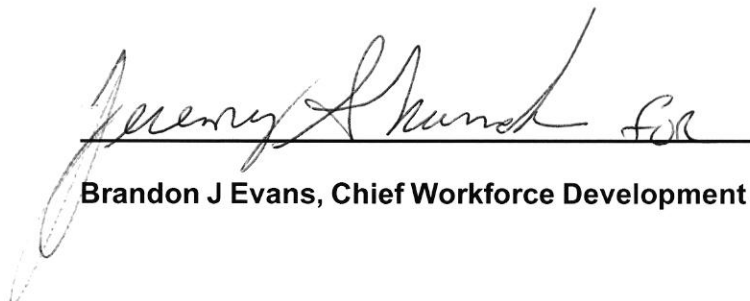
